What Are Nursery Rhymes?

A nursery rhyme is a simple traditional poem or song for children.

Nursery Rhymes date back to the late 1700s. The earliest versions were lullabies that mothers would sing to their babies.



Why Are Nursery Rhymes Still Used Today?

Listening to and singing nursery rhymes has been proven to be very beneficial to early development.

They encourage skills in communication, language and rhythm and help to develop an understanding of a wide range of vocabulary.

Through rhymes, children learn to play with words – this helps with blending sounds later when beginning to read and write.



Why Are Nursery Rhymes Still Used Nowadays?

Speaking steadily and rhythmically, giving eye contact and performing actions to songs all help to develop verbal and non-verbal communication skills.



The Benefits of Rhyme

Children love rhyme, rhythm and repetition. These three things found in songs and rhymes can naturally help to develop a child's language and literacy skills.

Studies have shown that children who enjoy music, singing and rhyming on a regular basis, tend to learn to speak more easily. They have more words to express themselves and are more confident and creative. Reading and spelling are easier to learn at school for these children too.



A Love of Learning

Opportunities to experience rhythm and rhyme help to form a love of language. This, in turn, will help to develop a love of reading and song; forming a solid foundation on which children value learning and literature.
